Memorial Lake State Park: Established on 230 acres in 1931 to honor Pennsylvania National Guard soldiers who served and died in World War I and II, it is surrounded by Fort Indiantown Gap. Memorial Lake offers outdoor recreation year-round.

Union Canal Tunnel Park: The 110 acres of recreational open space features three historical locks that were part of the Union Canal and includes a number of trails running along pasture, wooded areas, the canal, and farmlands. Visitors can also experience Narrated Canal Tours through the oldest existing transportation tunnel in the United States, each Sunday weather permitting, June through October.
